We will talk about why this is very important.</li> <li>We will always be modelling positive behavior and highlighting exemplary</li> <li>carefully and understand why listening is important.</li> <li>Children will be listening to longer stories and recalling what happens.</li> <li>We will be teaching the children a wide range of vocabulary.</li> <li>We will be teaching the children rhymes, how to talk about familiar books and how to tell stories.</li> <li>We will develop social communication. through learning saying 'Good moming!' or 'Are you feeling ok?', or stating 'Please don't do that, I don't like it!'.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>We will develop fast recognition of up to 3 objects, without having to count them individually ('subitising').</li> <li>We will learn to recite numbers up to 5 and beyond when ready.</li> <li>We will learn one number for each item in order: 1,2,3,4,5.</li> <li>Children will know that the last number reached when counting a small set of objects tells you how many there are in total ('cardinal principle').</li> <li>We will link numerals and amounts: for example, showing the right number of objects to match the numeral, up to 5.</li> <li>Pupils will be making, recognising and understanding AB patterns (e.g. +-+-+).</li> <li>All objectives regarding number are practised continually throughout the year to ensure that the children have the necessary understanding.</li> </ul>
We would like our children to understand that they can feel safe in their environment. We will be talking to the children, and teaching them to be healthy through: -Taking part in regular physical activity. -Making healthy eating choices -Teeth brushing		<ul> <li>In our RE topic, Myself, we will be learning that we are all special children of God.</li> <li>We will be learning that we are all precious to God and that we are all unique.</li> <li>In the 'Welcome' topic., we will be learning to say what it is like to be welcomed into somewhere.</li> <li>We will also be discussing Baptism.</li> </ul>

## Literacy

- The children will be developing their phonological awareness so they can spot and suggest rhymes, count or clap syllables and recognise words with the same initial sound.
- We will be learning the story '10 Little Superheroes' and looking at some non-fiction books about real-life superheroes. We will study language used in the book and spend time talking about stories we have read together.
- The children will be learning to write some letters accurately and practicing writing their names.

## Physical Development

We will develop gross motor skills including the following:

- Riding a bike or scooter.
- Building and completing assault courses with different levels of challenge.
- Playing active games such as 'Duck, Duck Goose' and 'Musical Statues'.
- Managing large items, such as moving a long plank safely or carrying large hollow blocks.

Understanding the World	Expressive Arts and Design
<ul> <li>This term is all about superheroes – particularly real-life heroes including the police, fire and ambulance services, as well as people who help us in our everyday lives.</li> <li>The children will be talking about members of their community and how they help us, naming and describing what they do.</li> <li>Children will be looking at pictures of people from the past and comparing similar jobs in today's world.</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Connected to the RE topic Myself, the children will be:</li> <li>Drawing self-portraits with increasing complexity and detail.</li> <li>Exploring colour and colour mixing.</li> <li>In Music, the children will be: <ul> <li>Remembering and singing entire songs.</li> <li>Copying the pitch of a tone sung by another person ('pitch match').</li> </ul> </li> <li>The children will be making imaginative and complex 'small worlds' with blocks and construction resources.</li> </ul>
